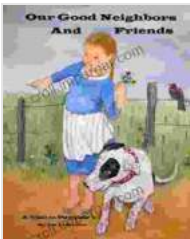


Our Good Neighbors and Friends Visit to Pawpaw

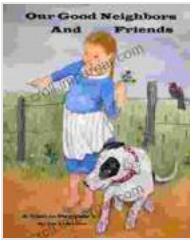
