
Philomena: A Heartbreaking True Story



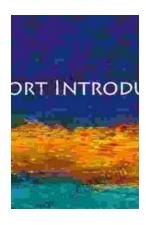
